

Revival Has Come to the Mountains

God is doing something special in the mountains of Appalachia. Over the past few months the ministry of ARO has seen the mighty work of God manifested through lives being redeemed, restored, and transformed. There isn't enough space in this newsletter to share all God is doing, but this ARO August/September '20 newsletter is dedicated to what is happening in our part of the country. Sunday, August 16 one of our local ministry partners, Meades Branch Free Will Baptist Church, began a one week revival. By the last night of revival, which was at the end of three weeks, there were 84 individuals who had given their heart to the Jesus. Most of these were high school and college age students. ARO had the privilege of being represented in these services for the 21 nights of revival services. These services were livestreamed and some nights there were as many as 10,000 views. Many nights there were between 6,000 – 8,000 views on the livestream. Even though these services came to an end on Sunday, September 6 at Meades Branch FWB Church, the ripple effect is still being felt in the heart of Appalachia. As we were in the middle of the three week revival at Meades Branch FWB Church, on Thursday night, August 28, Executive Director, Dwayne Mills, walked out of the service that evening to a message from one of the executive staff members from Addiction Recovery Care (ARC) This friend was touching base with Dwayne about one of our ministry partners, River Place Men's Residential Treatment Facility in Pike County, Kentucky. That day there had been a service held at this facility where 100 men gave their hearts to the Lord and over 40 were baptized. To hear the excitement in the voice of this friend in sharing this report, Dwayne stated, "I knew this was a continual work of God in the mountains". Pike County to the south and Lawrence County (Meades Branch FWB Church) to our north, it was evident God was doing a "new thing". Even as we put together this newsletter, God is still up to something special. All around eastern Kentucky God is showing up and touching lives in powerful ways. It's a wonderful time to be part of the mission and ministry of ARO. Being "Christ's love in action" is producing fruit that will impact eternity. God is on the move!

Because of quick actions of neighbors, medical staff (Three Rivers Louisa, KY and the Pediatric ICU Cabell Huntington, West Virginia), and most importantly the prayers of thousands of our friends and family, we believe the Lord miraculously touched our boy. Exactly two weeks from being bitten, Eli was back on the basketball court at close to 100%. This kind of injury usually takes months for full recovery. I believe because of the faithfulness of God's people to pray, God's healing hand touch our boy. Thank you for your commitment to pray. Funny side note...Eli just broke his arm this week and playing basketball will need to wait for at least 3 more weeks.
