As I mentioned before Rich was Appalachia Reach Out's Work & Witness Director for our West Virginia site in Nicholas County, WV. Because Rich & Thelma said YES to serving in this ministry role, there are individuals in heaven today. I want to share with you two message I received in the last year from Rich concerning two families that were impacted —

This was a testimony from Tanya sent to Dwayne, ARO's Executive Director, from Rich.

I want you to know that I've never seen happier, talented and good hearted group of young people in my life. After such dark and trying times I've gone through lately, it done my heart good yesterday to meet them and talk to a couple of them. The young lady that took me room by room explaining the repairs also took the time to tell me how many people has a hand on it all, so that I might have a nice and safe home. Their love and caring they have restored my faith and hope for our children. And those that take the time to teach them how to be good caring and loving people. I needed help and from strangers I've received more than I would've ever dreamed. You all are wonderful! May God bless you!

Another testimony from Rich about Katie. Katie was a young mother of a few children and Rich lead a team work on her home in the summer of 2022. I received this text last summer in 2023:

I wanted to pass this on to you. Katie died in her sleep last night. ARO built a roof over their deck and an out building for them last summer. Katie had the stage four cancer and grew very close to the two di erent teams. I believe she is in heaven today because of ARO.

Rich was married to Thelma for nearly 51 years and they raised three children together. They were blessed with 8 grandchildren and one great grand child. Rich had a passion for music and was accomplished on the piano and guitar. He loved collecting Lionel Trains and antique glass. He enjoyed working on old time pieces, both clocks and pocket watches.

Rich's legacy will continue to live on for generations to come. His commitment to loving and serving others will never be forgotten. As it was so eloquently stated at his celebration of life service, "I believe on the other side standing on the shores of Heaven Jesus said, "here he comes!" He will be my side for eternity. So as you think of him being gone here on earth, it's my prayer you'll remember he is gone from your presence, but is always in your heart, mind and he speaks through your life as he is now in the presence of Jesus for eternity! Mills family I hope you feel the love and warmth of our dear Savior now and in the days, weeks, and months to come!"
