

I was reading in the book of Daniel this week and read through the story of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego. If you haven't read that in a while, I would encourage you to go back to Daniel 3 and read it afresh.

I was reminded of the faith that these guys illustrated as they were challenged by King Nebuchadnezzar. It is hard to imagine how I would respond if placed in this same situation. However, our reality is that God calls us to serve Him and reject the kingdoms of this world every day. While we may not face a fiery furnace, we do face the temptation to give in to the pressures of this world.

As I was reading this passage I was reminded of what the 3 boys said in verse 17 "If we are thrown into the blazing furnace, the God we serve is able to deliver us from it, and he will deliver us from Your Majesty's hand. 18 But even if he does not, we want you to know, Your Majesty, that we will not serve your gods or worship the image of gold you have set up."

The beginning of verse 18 jumped out at me, when they said, "but if He does not." They knew that their God didn't call them to forsake them in the midst of the fire. The reality is that we serve a God who sometimes calls us to live way beyond our comfort zone. There are moments in this faith journey that we need this reminder, that "if He does not" answer the way are expecting, he is still God and is still in control.

I encourage you to live into this idea of serving God, even when we can't see the outcome of the ministry to which He is calling us. At times, the journey may be tough, but the outcome is certain and our God will walk through the fire with us!


ARO Welcomes Another Summer Intern
